

Packing List

Expedition to Washington, D.C.



Are you ready for your expedition? You are going to have a great time, but good preparation is a must. Traveling is best experienced when you go light. The airlines allow you to bring two suitcases and one carry-on, but we highly recommend just one carry-on and one check-in. It is very important to call your airline and check their new rules and regulations for what is allowed on board the airplane, or you can check www.tsa.gov for up-to-date information. You need to be at the airport at least 2 hours before departure. For groups of 35 or more, we recommend 2.5 hours before departure.

Allow extra room in your luggage for any gifts or souvenirs you purchase. We also suggest that you write your name and address on the inside of your suitcase. Put things you might need on the first day into your carry-on. Make sure to keep your money and ID with you during the entire trip.

WHILE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. YOU MAY NOT CARRY A BACKPACK. Almost every building in D.C. now has a security checkpoint. Please don't plan to carry your "stuff" in your backpack. Ladies may carry purses but know that in most buildings in D.C. you will be asked to open your purse for search.

You may not take any type of beverage container into buildings, so do not bring them. Even water bottles are prohibited.

CLOTHING

Remember that you are a representative of the Christian community, and modesty and respect for our country is perceived even in the way you dress.

- Comfortable clothes for daily activities, such as jeans, capris and t-shirts (if approved by group leader)
- Avoid metal belts or studs as they will set off metal detectors
- Comfortable walking shoes are necessary as you will be doing a lot of walking
- "Dressy" attire for tours of the Capitol and Arlington Cemetery
- Light jacket or sweater
- Warm jacket, gloves and scarf (especially Jan – Mar)
- Umbrella or rain jacket
- Joshua Expeditions t-shirt (to be worn on the 1st day of trip)

ACCESSORIES

- Bible, journal and pen
- Personal appliances
- Travel alarm clock and/or watch
- Toiletries
- Camera
- Extra film or memory cards
- Extra batteries
- Sunscreen (SPF 20 or higher)
- Strap for glasses

CLIMATE

Weather in D.C. can be variable, so be prepared for a variety of conditions. Especially during the spring and fall months, you can have sunny pleasant days in the 40s to 60s followed by SNOW!
